

**The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (Public Law 113-128)\***  
**PROGRAM YEAR 2019 FUNDING**

*PY 2019 WIOA funding is made available through the Department of Defense and Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education Appropriations Act, 2019 and Continuing Appropriations Act, 2019 (Pub. L. 115-245) dated September 28, 2018.\*\* Pursuant to the Act, ETA reserved \$7,774,000 of the funding appropriated for Training and Employment Services (TES) from the Youth, Adult and Dislocated Worker programs for evaluations and program integrity activities before allotments to states were calculated.*

<b>BASE (PY 2019)</b>	<b>ADVANCE (FY 2020)</b>
Appropriated and made available on April 1 and July 1 through the Act, dated September 28, 2018.	Funded in the Act, enacted September 28, 2018 but not made available until October 1, 2019. The FY 2020 appropriation can enact rescissions or temporary reductions on these funds.

**PY 2019 Allotments = Base (PY 2019) + Advance (FY 2020)**

<b>April 1, 2019</b> Release 100% of Program Year 2019 Youth funds	
<b>PY 2019 Youth Allotments</b>	

<b>July 1, 2019</b> Release approximately 16% of Program Year 2019 Adult funds	
	<b>October 1, 2019</b> Release approximately 84% of Program Year 2019 Adult funds or when the FY 2020 appropriation passes.
<b>PY 2019 Adult Allotments</b>	

<b>July 1, 2019</b> Release approximately 17% of Program Year 2019 Dislocated Workers funds	
	<b>October 1, 2019</b> Release approximately 83% of Program Year 2019 Dislocated Workers funds or when the FY 2020 appropriation passes.
<b>PY 2019 Dislocated Worker Allotments</b>	

FY 2020 Advance funds are available for obligations and expenditures on or after October 1, 2019. Delays in issuing the FY 2020 Advance funds may occur if there is a no approved DOL (budget) appropriation.

\* **Authorizing legislation** such as WIOA Public Law 113 -128 establishes policies and funding limits for programs and agencies.  
 \*\* **Appropriations legislation** gives Departments authority to obligate and expend federal funds related to the program authorizations. Appropriations can further restrict the purpose, time, and amount of the program authorizations and through the Anti-Deficiency Act, Departments are prohibited from overobligating or overspending an appropriation.
